Kevin attended local schools and graduated from Williams M. Raines High School in 1991. After graduation, he moved to Jacksonville, North Carolina to live with his older brother. While there he faced some life-changing challenges; but he made the best of the situation and attained skills and knowledge that proved to be major stepping-stones in his career as a successful entrepreneur and international real estate investor.

Kevin developed several businesses, both nationally and internationally. His gifts and talents allowed him to travel extensively all over the world, mentoring and motivating countless men and women to become better versions of themselves. With Kevin, there were no limits as he soared to higher heights, being grounded in his entrepreneurial endeavors. His transformation began in 1993 with his incarceration at just nineteen years of age. He often thanked God for putting him in a place where He could get his attention.

Kevin's higher educational learning skills were developed by the many correspondence courses he studied, and the mentorship he received from men of various walks of life. He earned his Bachelor's Degree (1998), Master's Degree (2001) and Doctorate Degree (2002) from Logos Christian College and Graduate School; where Dr. Charles Travis and Professor Thompson were so impressed with his study and work ethics, that they traveled to Jesup Federal Correctional Institution (Jesup FCI) to personally present him with his Doctorate Degree in International Biblical Studies. Kevin also went on to attain a Doctor of Philosophy from Vision International University in 2005.

As time passed, Kevin became one of the key spiritual leaders at Jesup FCI and led many souls to Christ. His infectious smile lit up every room he entered, and he never met a stranger. As the visitation center photographer, he interacted with many families and developed long-lasting friendships. His kind and humble spirit was one to be admired.

Upon changes in legislature, Kevin was released after serving eighteen years of a twenty-seven-year sentence for conspiracy. He returned home to Jacksonville just in time to attend the high school graduation of his eldest son, Kevin Jackson, II. He hit the ground running and never looked back. He was forward focused and put all his entrepreneurial skills and educational knowledge into play and began to build a legacy for his family.

Dr. Kevin Terrell Jackson, Sr. became a force to contend with, always willing to mentor and motivate others. As a father of two sons and two daughters, he put forth every effort to lay a foundation that would break all generational curses and lead to a legacy of wealth.

Kevin was enstooled as a King in Ghana, West Africa. His African name became, Nana Kwame Itsiah, II. He established the Dr. Kevin T. Jackson Foundation and was in the process of building a school of entrepreneurship in Ghana, where his legacy will live on. His motto was, "Live the life you love and love the life you live. And most importantly, never give up".




